Chapter One: Five Easy Pieces

Climate disruption is a bigger threat than any war we have ever faced. Mitigating climate change, if that's even possible, requires more from our generation than we have ever given.

We do not need another analogy to war. But in this chapter I offer five easy pieces to understand what we face, and to shape our understanding of what it will take to mount an adequate response. You'll recognize them and perhaps have your own additional ones. They shape the framework for action.
